## SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY

### **Rationale:**

- The wearing of school uniform is **strongly recommended** by School Council, Parents Club and staff.
- Competition in fashion dressing is negated and all students, regardless of socio-economic circumstance can feel equally part of the school community.
- A uniform dress code reinforces in students a pride in their own appearance, instils recognition of themselves as an integral part of the school community, and assists in developing pride in representing their school.
- The cost of providing the school uniform is almost always cheaper than providing an assortment of casual clothes.
- School uniform is designed to be practical for the range of activities undertaken at the school. All students are required to adhere to the prescribed uniform.

### **Aims:**

- To create a sense of pride in our school community and maintain a positive image of the school.
- To promote active and safe participation in school life.
- To promote equality amongst all students.

### **Dress Code:**

#### **SHIRTS & JUMPERS**

- Long or short sleeved bottle green polo shirt
- Bottle green polar fleece windcheaters, tops, jackets or vest (No hoodies)

#### **PANTS**

- Neat and tidy grey, navy or black
- Pants, shorts, tracksuit pants or skorts (no jeans, skins, multi-coloured leggings or extra short shorts)

#### **DRESSES**

- Green and white check dress
- Tights, leggings or bike-shorts may only be worn under a dress
- Shorts can also be worn under a dress

#### **HEAD WEAR**

- Bottle green bucket hats are required to be worn during 1<sup>st</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> terms and at the start of term 2 and the end of term 3 (September – May) in line with the School Council 'Sunsmart Policy'. Parents Club will provide a school hat to each new student who has been enrolled.
- Bottle green polar fleece beanies.

#### **SHOES**

- Neat and tidy sneakers, black school shoes or black work-boots.
- Sandals with closed toes can be worn on hot days.
- In winter, slippers, for use in the classroom, may be brought to school in order to help keep our classrooms clean.

### **Occupational Health & Safety**

- For safety reasons the wearing of thongs, gumboots or cowboy boots are not allowed.
- As per our 'Sunsmart Policy': Clothing should be loose fitting and shirts should have collars and sleeves. Singlet tops and muscle shirts are not SunSmart and should not be worn at school.
- When students are swimming outdoors they are required to wear a rashie vest or t-shirt.
- No jewellery is to be worn, apart from pierced ear studs or small sleepers

### **Evaluation:**

- This policy will be reviewed as part of the school's three-year review cycle.
